

THE STOCKHOLM ARBITRATION SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CHINA

There are three full-tuition scholarships available to Chinese Law School Graduates offered by three leading Swedish law firms: Gernandt and Danielsson, Mannheimer Swartling, and Vinge.

General information regarding the scholarship application

We aim to make the process of applying for a scholarship as simple as possible. When applying for a scholarship, it is important to remember that scholarships are awarded to the most exceptional applicants based on merits.

How to apply

Complete and submit the application form electronically. There is no need to provide any supporting documents with the application form, as we will acquire them directly from our Admissions Department.

Send the completed and signed application form in PDF format to master@juridicum.su.se or Christian.todoran@juridicum.su.se.

Please note that scholarship applicants must also separately apply to the Master programme in International Commercial Arbitration Law through the University admissions website, www.universityadmissions.se. Applications may be made from December 1, 2011 to January 16, 2012 or from March 15, 2012 to April 16, 2012.

The closing date for scholarship applications is **4 April 2012**.

Application process

Applications will be reviewed upon receipt, and shortlisted candidates will be considered throughout May and early June. Successful scholarship applicants will be contacted in May/June. Please inform us should you need an early decision.

Unfortunately, we are unable to notify all applicants of the result of their application or to provide feedback on individual applications due to the volume of applications and interest that we receive. If you do not hear from us by the end of June, please assume that your scholarship application has been unsuccessful.

The scholarship is valid throughout the entire one-year study period for the 2012/2013 academic year and covers the tuition fee for this period. Scholarships are



only valid for the 2012/2013 academic year and cannot be deferred. Applicants that wish to delay their studies must reapply for the scholarship.

Eligible students

Chinese citizens with a Bachelor of Laws degree from a university in China.

To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must hold a university diploma in laws or an equivalent law degree of at least 120 (180 ECTS) credit points (a three-year-degree) at the time of application. Applicants must also meet the English language requirements for admission to the programme.
