

Public Law 106–152 106th Congress

#### An Act

To amend title 18, United States Code, to punish the depiction of animal cruelty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### SECTION 1. PUNISHMENT FOR DEPICTION OF ANIMAL CRUELTY.

(a) IN GENERAL.-Chapter 3 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

#### "§48. Depiction of animal cruelty

"(a) CREATION, SALE, OR POSSESSION.-Whoever knowingly creates, sells, or possesses a depiction of animal cruelty with the intention of placing that depiction in interstate or foreign commerce for commercial gain, shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than 5 years, or both.

"(b) EXCEPTION—Subsection (a) does not apply to any depiction that has serious religious, political, scientific, educational, journalistic, historical, or artistic value.

"(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

"(1) the term 'depiction of animal cruelty' means any visual or auditory depiction, including any photograph, motion-picture film, video recording, electronic image, or sound recording of conduct in which a living animal is intentionally maimed, mutilated, tortured, wounded, or killed, if such conduct is illegal under Federal law or the law of the State in which the creation, sale, or possession takes place, regardless of whether the maiming, mutilation, torture, wounding, or killing took place in the State; and

"(2) the term 'State' means each of the several States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and any other commonwealth, (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections for such

chapter is amended by adding at the end the following:

"48. Depiction of animal cruelty.".







# Codes

 Un-annotated: usually codes published by the federal or state governments Annotated:

- published by commercial publishers based on official codes, the major publishers are West and Lexis
- Annotated with descriptions of cases interpreting the statutes, historical notes, and references to secondary materials discussing the statutes

## United States Code Annotated (USCA)

- Published by West
- Based on United States Code
- Annotated with cases, references to secondary materials, such as law review articles, etc.



#### § 3. Accessory after the fact

Whoever, knowing that an offense against the United States has been committed, receives, relieves, comforts or assists the offender in order to hinder or prevent his apprehension, trial or punishment, is an accessory after the fact.

Except as otherwise expressly provided by any Act of Congress, an accessory after the fact shall be imprisoned not more than one-half the maximum term of imprisonment or (notwithstanding section 3571) fined not more than one-half the maximum fine prescribed for the punishment of the principal, or both; or if the principal is punishable by life imprisonment or death, the accessory shall be imprisoned not more than 15 years.



Example: U.S. v. Diaz, 936 F.2d 786 (5<sup>th</sup> Cir. 1991)

To establish a violation of <u>8 USCA §</u> <u>1324(a)(1)(A)(ii)</u>, the government must prove: (1) the transporting or moving of an alien within the United States; (2) that the alien was present in violation of the law; (3)that the defendant was aware of the alien's illegal status; and (4) that the defendant acted willfully in furtherance of the alien's violation of the law.



Provision of Arizona's Support Our Law Enforcement and Safe Neighborhoods Act, making it illegal for person who violation of criminal offense to, inter alia, transport alien in Arizona in furtherance of alien's unlawful presence in United States, did not directly conflict with, so as to be preempted by, provision of federal alien smuggling statu providing exception for certain religious groups for contact with volunteer ministers and missionaries; Arizona states narrower than its federal counterpart because it required that person already be in violation of criminal offer U.S. v. #### 1. Constitutionality

In prosecution for harboring aliens unlawfully residing in United States, district court's use of term "illegal alien" during sentencing hearing did not violate corporate defendant's due process rights or right to appearance of fairr in sentencing proceedings, where term "illegal alien" was never used in front of jury, case resulted in conviction plea, and term was used to describe individual's working for defendant, not defendant itself. <u>U.S. v. (t)(1) Beginning on the date that is 30 days after the Attorney General notifies licensees under section 103(d) of the Brady Handgun Violence Prevention Act that the national instant criminal background check system is established, a licensed importer, licensed manufacturer, or licensed dealer shall not transfer a firearm to any other person who is not licensed ander this chapter, unless---

(A) before the completion of the transfer, the licensee contacts the national instant criminal background check system established under section 103 of that Act;

(B)(i) the system provides the licensee with a unique identification number; or

(ii) 3 business days (meaning a day on which State offices are open) have elapsed since the lisensee contasted the system, and the system has not notified the licensee that the receipt of a firearm by such other person would violate subsection (g) or (n) of this section; and


(t)(1) Beginning on the date that is 30 days after the Attorney General notifies licensees under section 103(d) of the Brady Handgun Violence Prevention Act that the national instant criminal background check system is established, a licensed importer, licensed manufacturer, or licensed dealer shall not transfer a firearm to any other person who is not licensed under this chapter, unless--

(A) before the completion of the transfer, the licensee contacts the national instant criminal background check system established under section 103 of that Act;

(B)(i) the system provides the licensee with a unique identification number; or


(ii) 3 business days (meaning a day on which State offices are open) have elapsed since the licensee contacted the system, and the system has not notified the licensee that the receipt of a firearm by such other person would violate subsection (g) or (n) of this section; and

**(C)** the transferor has verified the identity of the transferee by examining a valid identification document (as defined in <u>section 1028(d)</u> of this title) of the transferee containing a photograph of the transferee.



Sheriff was not entitled to injunction prohibiting enforcement of Brady Act, which imposed upon him duty to conduct background check before issuing handgun permits; sheriff failed to show irreparable harm based on his claims that his assignment of jailor to processing of handgun permit applications increased likelihood of injury to inmates, as sheriff cited no actual incidents of inmate injury occurring during approximately 20 months since he had jailor assigned to researching permits, and balance of harm between parties did not support granting of preliminary injunction, as, if injunction were issued, but Brady Act later found to be constitutional, United States would not be able to correct issuance of handgun permits without background check required by Brady Act. <u>Frye v. Provision of Brady Act which required local law enforcement officials to conduct background searches of prospective purchasers of handguns was unconstitutionally vague in failing to make explicit what would be "reasonable" effort to determine whether receipt or possession of handgun would be in violation of the law, while providing for criminal pupiebment of officers who failed to make such reasonable effort.









## Strategy – Statutory Research

- 1. Access generally through the index or popular name table
- 2. Browse the statutory outline for pertinent related statutes
- 3. You must be sure the statute is exactly on point
- 4. If it is a complex statute make sure you thoroughly understand the statutory scheme
- 5. Don't just read the section you find from the index, browse the whole chapter
- 6. You must be prepared to analogize other similar statutes
- 7. You must update
